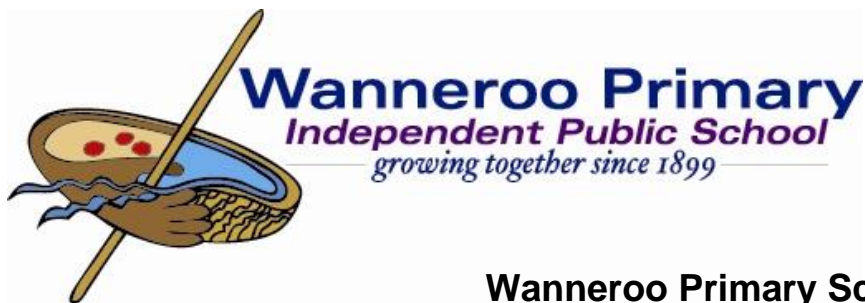

Wanneroo Primary School Dress Code Policy

Introduction

The Wanneroo Primary School Board has established a dress code for students attending Wanneroo Primary School.

The Wanneroo Primary School Board believes a School Dress Code

- Fosters and enhances the public image of the school
- Assists in building school and team spirit
- Ensures students are safely dressed for specific school activities
- Encourages equity among students
- Provides students with protection from the sun when they are outdoors.

Availability of Dress Code items

- Items in the designated school colours may be purchased from the P&C uniform shop.
- Second hand uniforms may be available.
- Sports uniforms may be ordered through the uniform shop.
- Students whose families may experience financial difficulties regarding the purchase of a uniform should contact the principal to discuss the situation.

Modifications to the Dress Code

Students who for religious or health reasons, may wish to modify the school dress code are required to make an appointment with the principal. Staff will be informed of any student granted a modification to the dress code.

Students not following the Dress Code

Students not following the Dress code will receive:

- Counselling from the principal or delegate on the benefits of the dress code; and
- Assistance/support in obtaining suitable clothing if necessary.

Students not following the dress code may be denied the opportunity to represent the school at official school activities, which include choir, sporting and social events.

Application of the Dress Code

- Fashion accessories and nail polish should not be worn to school.
- Long hair must be tied back.
- A "no hat/no play" policy for the playground has been adopted.
- The sports uniform should be worn for the school and interschool athletics carnivals. During Term 3 the sports uniform will be worn for athletics practice. The school will notify parents of the days on which the sports uniform should be worn.
- Appropriate footwear should be worn such as buckled sandals, joggers or leather shoes with rubber soles. Thongs, boots, skate shoes, gumboots and scuffs are not considered safe or appropriate footwear.
- Students need to be able to remove and put on their own footwear.
- Uniforms are optional for students in kindergarten.
- Clothing with offensive slogans, messages, pictures or designs is not acceptable.
- All clothing and footwear should be clean and appropriate for school use.
